

To the Voters and Citizens of The City of Campbell and Coitsville Township:

On November 7, we will be electing a new Judge for the Campbell Municipal Court due to the retirement of current Judge Patrick Cunning. I am a Candidate for the position of Judge for our Municipal Court, and I ask for your vote on Election Day.

I have been licensed to practice law for 31 years, and I have served as Director of Law for a total of over 23 years – the longest tenure of any Director of Law in Campbell’s history. Over my time in office, in addition to providing legal counsel to the City’s administration and council, I have served as Prosecutor for Campbell and Coitsville. I have prosecuted over 10,000 criminal and traffic cases, ranging from minor traffic offenses to murder. Since December 2011, we have seized over \$800,000.00 from drug-related arrests – money used to equip our police officers at no taxpayer expense. Both the Campbell and Coitsville Police Departments know that I am available to them 24 hours a day, seven days a week.


I have been very involved with the Municipal Court’s procedures and operations. I have worked closely with Judge Cunning and his staff on matters and issues important to a properly functioning Court, such as: finances, budgeting, personnel, facilities management and security. In addition, I served four years as Judge Cunning’s Acting Judge. Finally, I possess a strong background in civil and criminal law, as well as evidence and procedure rules. These skills and experience makes me uniquely qualified to serve as the next Judge of our Municipal Court.

Campbell has been my lifetime home. I am the son of John and Mary Lou Macala, and their dedication and involvement in our community was instilled in me. I graduated from Campbell Memorial High School in 1985; Youngstown State University in 1989; and, The Cleveland-Marshall College of Law in 1992. I have always been dedicated to the organizations of our community, especially those focused on our school district and youth, such as my longtime sponsorship of the Campbell Flag Football and Baseball programs.

It is my intention to continue to operate our Court in a fiscally responsible fashion so that its operation is not a drain on the City’s finances. I also intend to expand community service programs so that convicted Defendants will render a service back to our community. Finally, I pledge to operate our Court consistent with our community standards, and in a fair and impartial manner. All persons appearing in Court will be confident that their case will be heard and decided objectively, free of bias and consistent with the law.
